

NDHU Instructions Regarding Subsidized Scholarship for Outstanding Overseas Chinese Graduate Students

Amended on December 21, 2016

Amended on May 24, 2017

- I. These instructions have been formulated in accordance with the Regulations Regarding Subsidized Scholarship funded by the Ministry of Education for Colleges and Universities to encourage outstanding overseas Chinese students to study at an NDHU graduate institute.
- II. Application criteria:
 - (a) Outstanding overseas Chinese students studying at an NDHU graduate institute pursuant to the Regulations Regarding Study and Counseling Assistance for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan.
 - (b) Enrollment at an NDHU graduate institute (excluding deferred students) and successful completion of a minimum of one semester (including students directly admitted to doctoral programs)
 - (c) Require a minimum of six credits per semester, and average academic and conduct grades of 80 or above of the previous semester
 - (d) Overseas Chinese students shall not be eligible to apply for subsidized scholarship if they already receive tuition subsidies, exemptions, or scholarships from the government pursuant to other regulations.
- III. Quota: Allocated by the Ministry of Education in accordance with the reported number of currently enrolled overseas Chinese graduate students per semester
- IV. Scholarship amount: Minimum monthly amount of NT\$ 10,000 per student
- V. Required documents:
 - (a) Application form
 - (b) Academic transcript of the previous semester (including class ranking), accounts for 60%
 - (c) Study plan, accounts for 15%
 - (d) Autobiography, accounts for 10%
 - (e) Letter of recommendation from a department professor, accounts for 10%
 - (f) Relevant service certificates awarded within one year, accounts for 5%
- VI. Application period: Applications are handled in the first ten days of March and October. Applicants shall submit the required applications document to the International Recruitment and Admissions Division of the Office of International Affairs within 10 days after the date of announcement (not including public holidays).
- VII. The International Recruitment and Admissions Division shall be in charge of review procedures. Reviews shall be carried out in the respective semester in accordance with the quota determined by the Ministry of Education. The list of selected scholarship recipients shall then be approved by the university president upon request.
- VIII. Scholarship payments shall be terminated if one of the following conditions exists:

- (a) Payments shall be terminated starting from the month following the effective date of application for suspension or termination of studies, transfer, change of enrollment status, or loss of student status.
- (b) Payments shall be terminated starting from the month following public notice by the University, if students receive a minor demerit or above in the academic year.
- (c) If overseas scholarship recipients have provided fabricated documents or false information, payments shall be terminated and received scholarships shall be paid back. Besides, charges shall be pressed pursuant to the relevant laws.

IX. Where one of the aforementioned conditions occurs, the scholarship shall be awarded to the student placed first on the waiting list.

X. These instructions and all amendments thereof shall come into effect upon approval by the University president.
